

Through a long process, the proposed Clean and Safe Services were finally ready to be implemented beginning on June 14, 2021. Since then, the Cleaning and Safety Ambassadors have made significant strides towards the "Clean and Safe" goals of the initiative. Community feedback has been very positive, and while challenges persist in the community, we now have an established way to address them quickly and efficiently. Franklinton Board of Trade manages the FSID, and we are extremely proud of the results that have been achieved in advocating for and creating safety, as well as cleaning and beautifying the streets. These successes create a better environment and a sense of pride and confidence throughout the community, which is our main goal. Advocate, Beautify, Connect is the mission of FBOT. 







FSID Safety Ambassador Activity (Q3)






We are very proud to share this testimonial from a long-standing Franklinton business:

"Trent approached us about a grant in which the city would match any dollar investment we made to our business up to a certain amount. Forgive me as I don't remember the name of the grant or the dollar amount, but we were able to use the grant to construct a massive walk-in cooler/freezer behind our building. This is the example that I labeled as a game changer for us. Again, our restaurant isn't very big, and we are limited on space, so storage was always an issue. With the type of volume we would have, it made things very difficult holding enough inventory on hand to meet the demand so we would run out of items or have to run to different stores daily. We would have multiple coolers and freezers wherever space would allow, which created several inefficiencies for us. These multiple units also resulted in extremely high electric bills.

Trent's knowledge and communication of the opportunities that were available to Franklinton small business owners was instrumental for us. It created big long-term results for our business. I call this example a 'game changer' as we were then able to have enough inventory on hand because we simply had the space with the walk-in unit. All our cooler/freezer items were then relocated in one easily accessible location for our staff, which improved operations. A walk-in was something we always wanted to build but the cost was so high that it was difficult for us. The efficiency of the walk-in also lowered our utilities.

Having a neighborhood advocate who not only looks after businesses in our community but also brings things to their table that they otherwise would not have known has been a tremendous asset for us."

Beautify: The Human Benefits of Cleaner Columbus

To administer the Cleaner Columbus program, Franklinton Board of Trade partnered with Sanctuary Night to provide employment opportunities to its clients. These clients are individuals who deal with a variety of significant life challenges daily. The 2023 program engaged 33 unique individuals, and realized the following results after they began participating:

- 10 of them have secured housing
- 7 obtained and/or maintained sobriety/recovery
- 6 started attending inpatient or outpatient substance use treatment programs
- 11 received assistance with the legal system for such things as, getting their identification or license back, resolving warrants, resolving issues that are barriers to regular employment, transportation to court, etc.
- 1 gave birth to a child and has remained an active parent in that child's life
- 1 successfully completed and graduated from CATCH court and probation
- 1 purchased a motorcycle and legally registered it with Ohio plates
- All 33 received some form of medical care through Sanctuary Night partnership with healthcare providers.
- 2 obtained full-time regular employment

Where it all started...

Pictured here is the railroad overpass in the 500 block of W Broad St., the location where the Gravity development is today.

Back in March of 1904, when the Franklinton Board of Trade was started (originally called West Side Board of Trade), elevating the tracks, as shown in this picture, was the goal and purpose of the organization. The businesspeople of the community were tired of waiting for frequent trains to pass by before they could access Downtown. Completed in 1911, the leadership of the BOT decided if they had success with such a huge task as elevating railroad tracks, they should continue to be advocates for not just the business community, but the whole community. Proudly, and with your support, we continue to do so, 120 years later!
